My most recommended products to get you off to the best start!

Item	Why It Matters	Tip/How to Choose
Garden Tool Set (trowel, transplanter, weeder, hand rake, pruners, gloves, tote)	Essential for digging, planting, weeding, harvesting. A good quality set saves frustration.	Look for sturdy metal, comfortable handle grips; store tools in a tote so you can carry everything easily.
Seed-Starting Tray + Humidity Dome	Helps germination: holds moisture & warmth, protects seedlings.	Choose trays with clear domes and vents. Clean them well to avoid disease.
Seedling Heat Mat	Keeps soil temperature steady → faster, more even sprouting.	Get one with adjustable thermostat so you don't overheat seedlings.
LED Grow Lights	Useful if starting seeds indoors or with low light. Prevents weak, leggy seedlings.	Full-spectrum LEDs; adjustable height; timer helpful.

Item	Why It Matters	Tip/How to Choose
Organic Seed Packs (herbs, vegetables, flowers)	Foundation of garden: choosing good seed gives you more variety and control.	Start with beginner-friendly seeds: radishes, lettuce, cilantro, etc. Choose non-GMO, trusted brands.
Raised Bed & Potting Mix	Good soil = strong roots. If soil is poor or your space is raised beds / containers, high-quality mix is essential.	Look for a mix that drains well but holds moisture. Avoid heavy clay or very sandy soils alone.
Mushroom Compost	Adds organic matter, improves moisture retention and feeds beneficial soil life.	Use a compost that's well composted to avoid burning plants. Mix into soil before planting.
Starter Fertilizer (like Bio-Tone)	Helps transplanted seedlings settle in & grow strong roots.	Use at transplant time; follow label carefully. Organic mixes are gentle & safer for young plants.
Spray Bottle / Handheld Sprayer	Good for delicate tasks (seedlings) and applying	Clean between uses, avoid cross-contamination.

My Tips for Getting Started

- Start Small. One raised bed or a few containers is enough to build confidence.
- Focus on Easy Plants. Lettuce, radishes, cilantro, onions, etc., are forgiving and grow fast.
- **Be Consistent.** Spending just a few minutes each day makes more difference than long weekends.
- Take Notes. What worked this week, what didn't—garden diaries are gold.
- **Enjoy the Process.** Don't worry about perfection. Gardening is a journey.
